

Setup of Device When Wi-Fi is Not Available

It is necessary to set up your iOS device before using it. These steps or the look of the screens may vary slightly from device to device; however, they must be completed before the device can be used.

Initial Setup with Wi-Fi Available

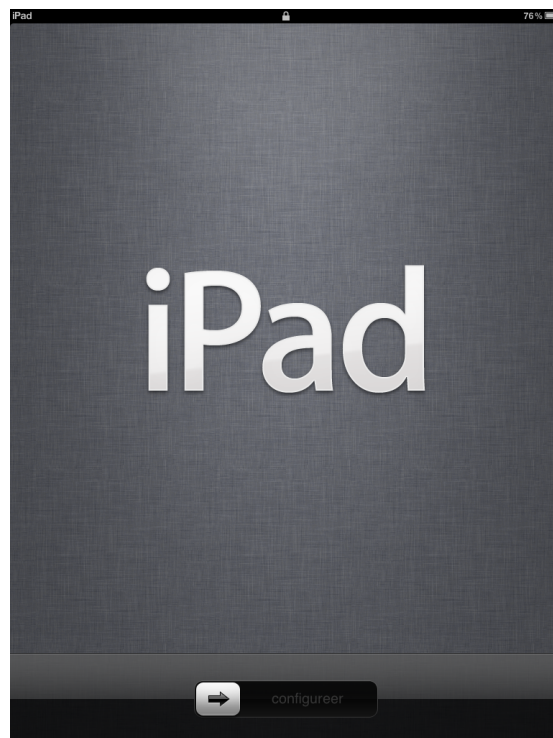


Figure 1: Initial Setup Screen

Press the On/Off button on the top right edge of the device. If the device was turned off, an Apple logo will appear while the device turns on. The following screens will appear as you set up the device the first time. The initial setup screen will show the type of device (e.g., iPad) as shown in Figure 1 below.

1. Tap the right facing arrow at the bottom center of the screen and drag to the right to move to the next setup screen.

2. Language Setup Screen

- a. Tap the desired language (see Figure 2).

- b. If you can see the name of your language, select it and proceed to step (c) just below. If your language is not visible and you see a screen that looks like Figure 2 above, tap the arrow just below the Español option for a long list of language options. Once on that list, you can tap toward the bottom of the screen and flick up to keep scrolling through the list until you can see and select your language.
 - c. Tap the blue and white right-facing arrow in the upper right corner of the screen to move to the next screen in the setup process.
3. Country or Region Setup Screen
 - a. Tap United States if appropriate (see Figure 3).

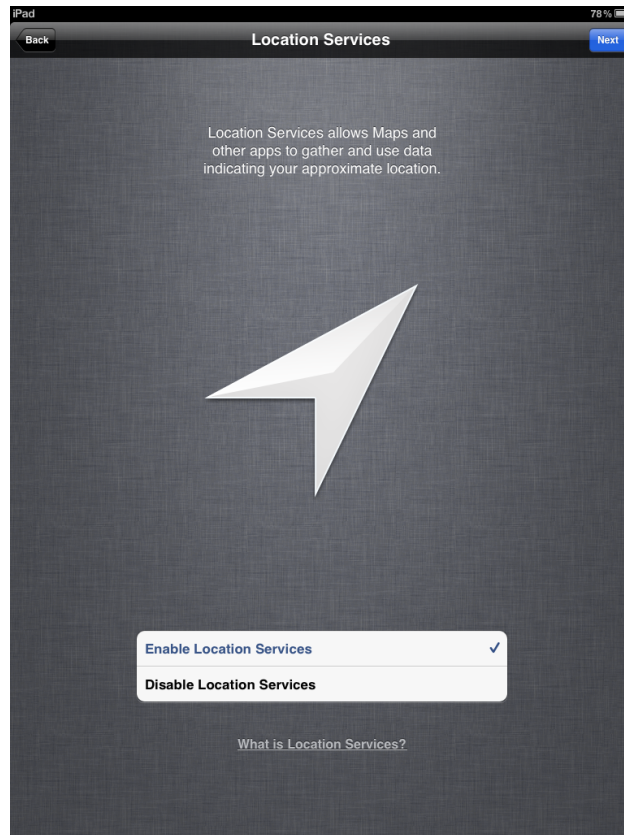


Figure 4: Location Services Screen

- b. Tap Next in the upper right corner of the screen to move to the next screen in the setup process.
5. Wi-Fi Networks Setup Screen

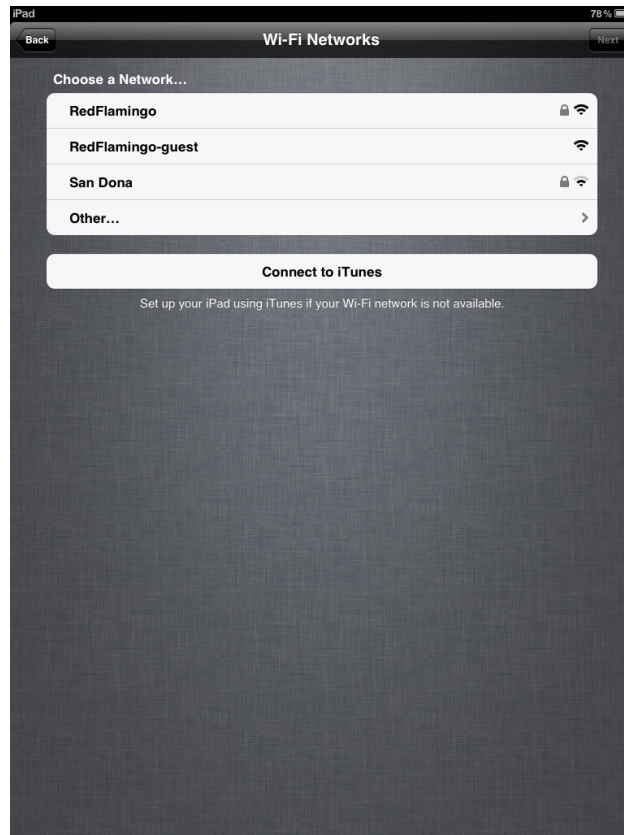


Figure 5: Wi-Fi Networks Screen

 - a. The iPad can be set up even if Wi-Fi is not available (see Figure 5); in this case, a laptop or desktop computer with iTunes installed is required. Tap Connect to iTunes from the Wi-Fi Networks screen.

- b. Plug the USB end of the cable that came with the device into the computer and the connector end into the device.

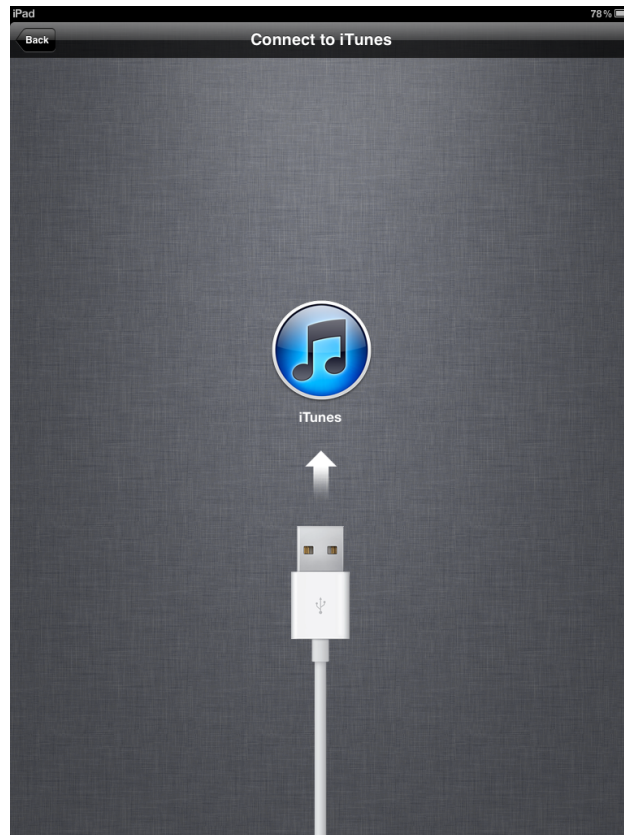


Figure 6: iTunes Screen

- c. Enter your Apple ID and Password in iTunes on the computer. The Set Up iPad screen should appear on your iPad.
6. Set Up iPad Setup Screen

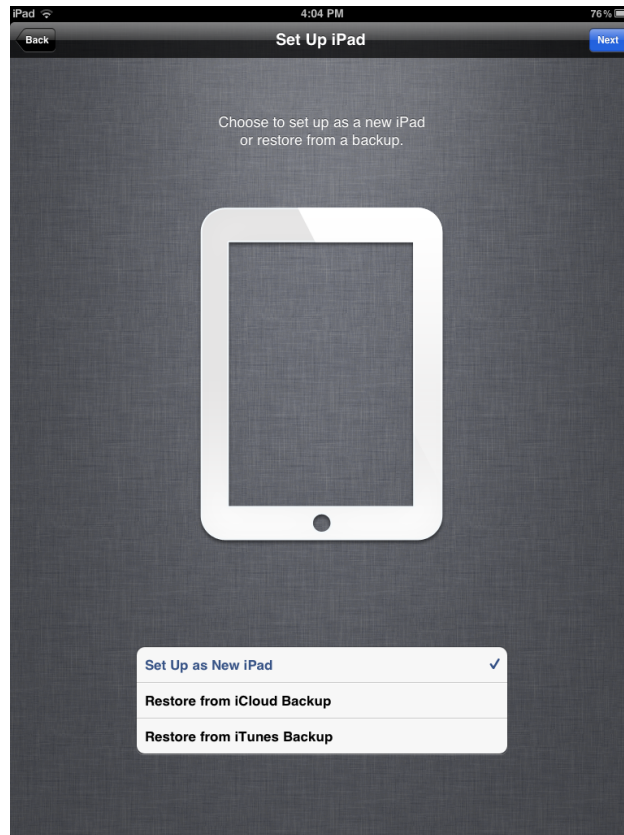


Figure 7: Set Up iPad Screen

 - a. Tap the Set Up as New iPad option (see Figure 7).

- b. Tap Next in the upper right corner of the screen to move to the next screen in the setup process.
7. Apple ID Setup Screen

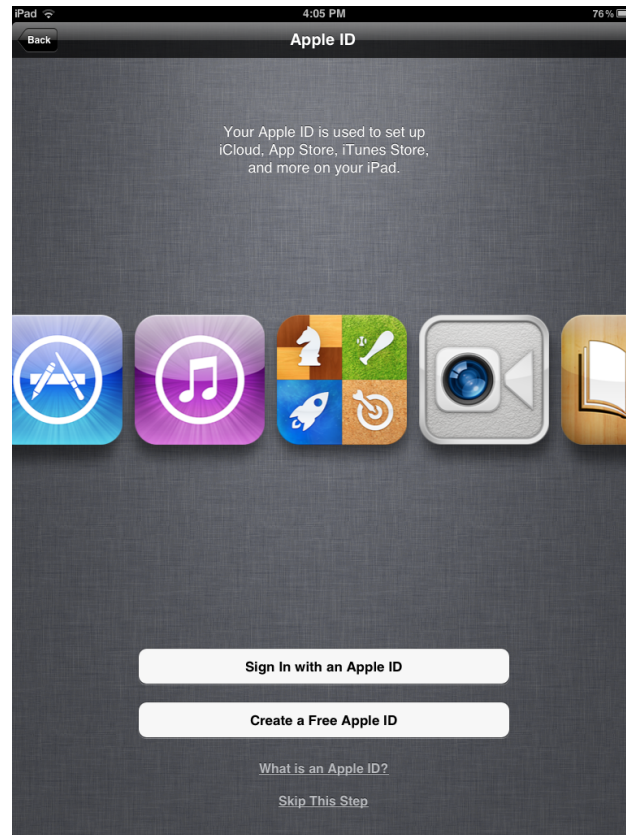


Figure 8: Apple ID Screen

 - a. Tap the Sign in with an Apple ID option if you already have an Apple ID (see Figure 8). This step can be skipped and completed at a later time.

If you do not have an Apple ID, you can create one from this screen. Creating an Apple ID at this point requires Internet access. For information on creating an Apple ID, visit the following URL:

- b. To skip this step and move on with the device setup, tap the Skip This Step option at the bottom of the screen.

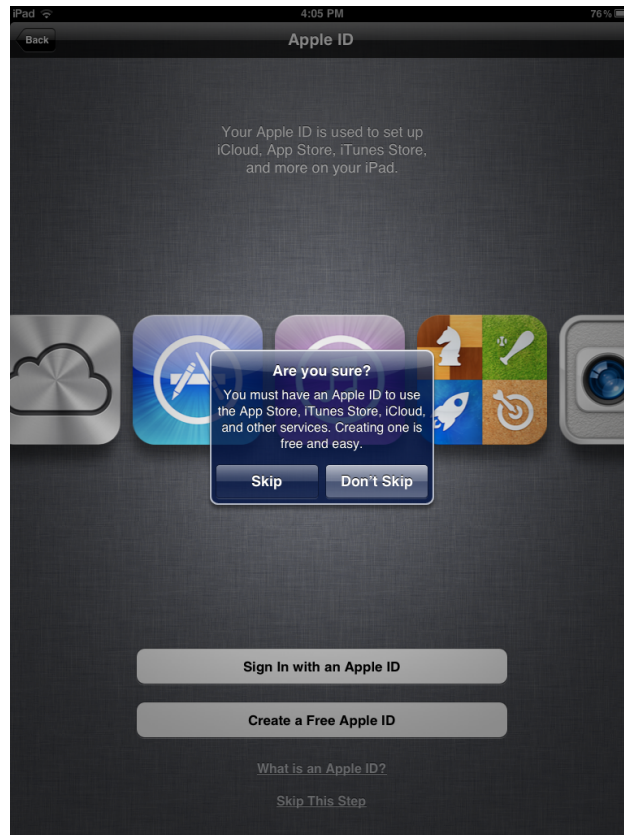


Figure 9: Apple ID Screen

- c. Tap Skip as shown in Figure 9.

8. Terms and Conditions Setup Screen

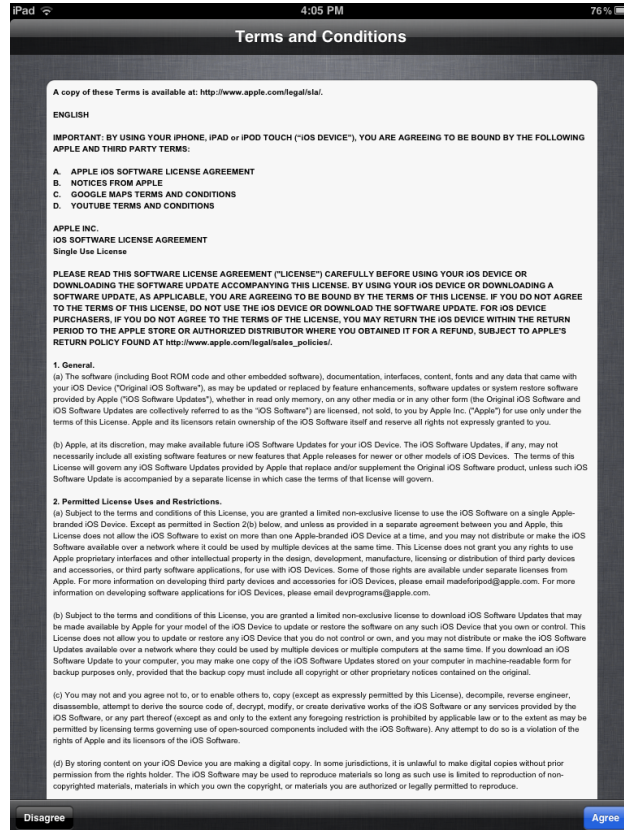


Figure 10: Terms and Conditions Screen

 - a. Tap Agree in the lower right corner (see Figure 10).

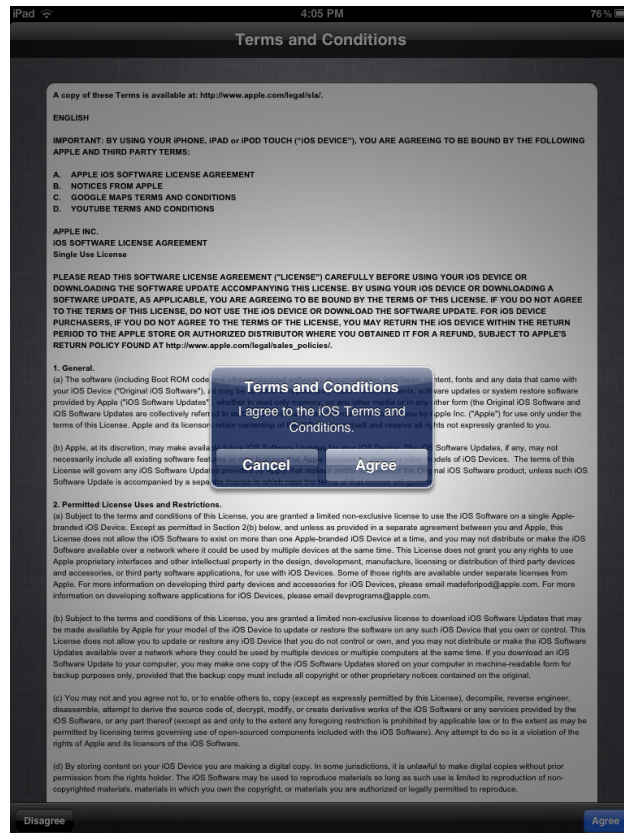


Figure 11: Terms and Conditions Confirmation Screen

b. Tap Agree again as shown in Figure 11.

- c. Tap Next in the upper right corner of the screen to move to the next screen in the setup process.

9. Diagnostics Setup Screen

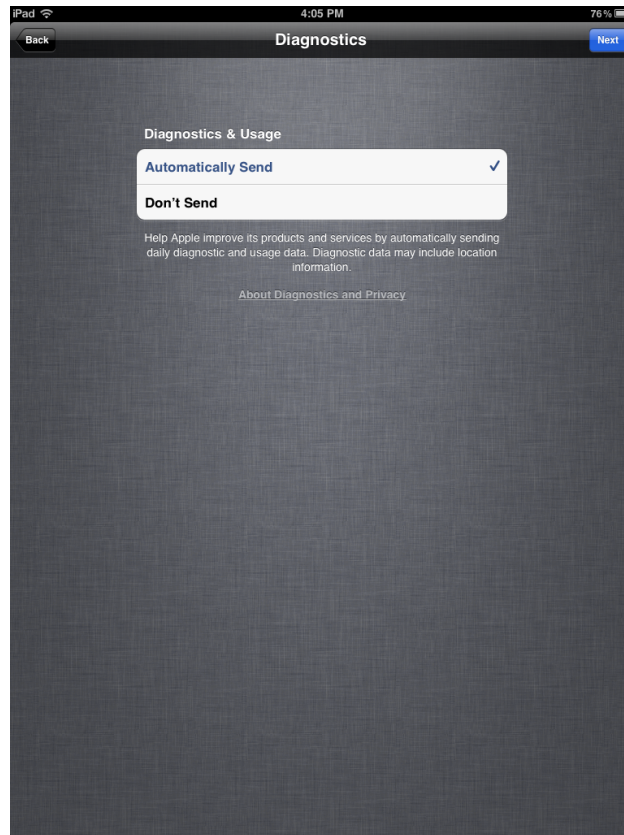


Figure 12: Diagnostics Screen

- a. Tap either Automatically Send or Don't Send (see Figure 12).

- b. Tap Next in the upper right corner of the screen to move to the next screen in the setup process.

10. Thank You Setup Screen

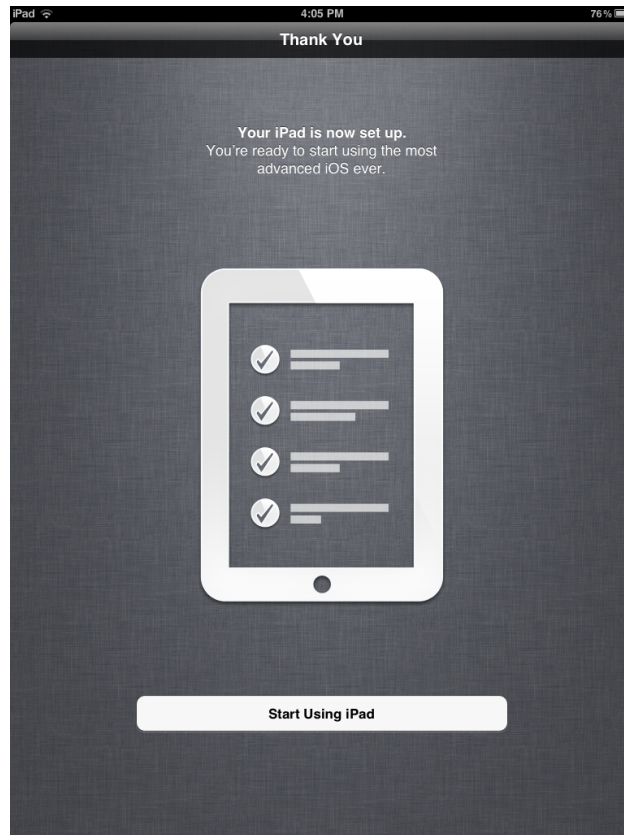


Figure 13: Thank You Screen

- a. Tap Start Using iPad (see Figure 13).
